


- 1. Lay out the 5 pieces to identify them. Pieces 1 and 2 are identical, piece 4 has the groove in the smooth side, and piece 3 is grooved on the textured side.
- 2. Place pieces 1 and 2 on the right and left sides of the glove box, textured side visible. Make sure the grooves are horizontal, and the groove closest to the edge is at the top.
- **3.** Slide piece 3 into the lower groove, keeping the grooved side up. It will not contact both grooves until it is inserted about 3/4 of the way in. When it is seated in both grooves, push the shelf firmly until it is flush with pieces 1 and 2.
- **4.** Insert piece 4 in the upper grooves in the same manner, but with the grooved side down.
- **5.** Slide the divider, piece 5, between the upper and lower shelves and into the grooves in pieces 3 and 4.





Organizer too tight or too loose?

Due to some variances in glove box size and dimensions of the organizer, occasionally buyers find the organizer fits a little too tight or too loose.

If your glove box organizer fits too loose:

Make sure the side pieces (1 & 2) are pushed all the way to the rear of the glove box. Since the glove box is tapered, it's wider at the front which can make it loose if not pushed all the way back. You can also put one or two strips of duct tape on the back side of pieces 1 and 2. If the top shelf is loose, put the tape behind the top groove, and likewise for the bottom shelf. This is usually enough to make the organizer fit tightly.

If your glove box organizer fits too tight:

Make sure the shelf pieces (3 & 4) are inserted INTO the grooves in the sides. If they are in the grooves properly, try pulling the side pieces (1 & 2) slightly toward the front of the glove box, leaving a small gap at the rear. Since the glove box opening is tapered, moving the side pieces an eighth of an inch forward can make a big difference in how it fits.
